After moving to Dublin in 2012, they quickly became a staple of the live music and session scene in Ireland, playing their own original songs as well as folk songs from Ireland, Scotland, England and America. Since then, they have been busy touring Ireland, the UK and Europe, opening for acts such as **Villagers**, **Roy Harper** and **Lisa Hannigan** (whose band they played in for her Irish tour, June 2016). New album *Nine Waves* follows the duo's standalone single I'm A Rover, which won them an **RTÉ Radio One Folk Award** for Best Traditional Folk Track. Ye Vagabonds were also named **Best Folk Group** for the second time at the 2021 ceremony, where they hold the record for most awarded artists.
